Opening Remarks (8:30 to 9:00 AM)

Dom Bautista, Executive Director of Law Courts Center

Paramedics: Live and in Living Colour (9:00 to 10:00 AM)

Develop your understanding of pre-hospital care, while Kevin Sandford and Michelle Finlay, senior paramedics, attend to a person involved in a motor vehicle accident. Watch how patient care at the scene evolves and a patient care record comes to life.

CSI Vancouver Police Department Style (10:00 to 10:45 AM)

Constables David Moe and Jeffrey Schell, Vancouver Police Collision Investigation Unit will discuss collision statistics/history, as well as what they specifically investigate and why. They will then describe what they do at a collision scene with roadway evidence, vehicles, photographs. You will also see what paperwork gets generated during the early stages of the collision (scene sketch, MV6020).

Hospital Records 101 (11:00 to 12:00 PM)

Ms. Sally Mastrantonio is with the Lions Gate Hospital Health Records Release of Information Department. She will discuss how the health records department is structured. Learn the best practices to request and receive patient records in a timely and less stressful manner.

The ICBC Claims Process (1:00 to 2:45 PM)

Glen Per, ICBC'S Area E Bodily Injury Regional Manager, will take you through the claims process from the time a new claim is reported to Dial a Claim, the first meeting at the claim center, the determination of coverage, liability, investigation evaluation, mediation and if necessary, trial. They will provide standard ICBC forms and explain the reasons for each as well as discuss breaches in coverage, the LVI program, and explain the differences in entitlement to tort and no-fault accident benefits. (A veteran of 18 years, Glen serves as the corporate liaison to many professional associations. Together with Bodily Injured Adjuster, Daniella Re, they look forward to answering your questions.)

Forensic Engineering - Whose Side Are They On? (3:00 to 4:00 PM)

Dennis Chimich and Jonathan Lawrence are forensic engineers with MEA Forensic Engineering. Jonathan will talk about accident reconstruction and its role in analyzing a motor vehicle collision. Dennis will focus on the application of the science of injury biomechanics to technically assess injury causation in motor vehicle collisions. Their presentation will include how an injury biomechanics analysis is performed, the qualifications of an injury biomechanical engineer, and the materials needed for the analysis. Their presentation will also include case examples demonstrating the uses of injury biomechanics in motor vehicle collisions. Most importantly, they will provide a sample injury biomechanic's report.

What is a Structured Settlement? (4:00 to 4:45 PM)

Brenda Dayton Cesareo will provide an overview of what a structured settlement is, its components and when to consider it. Also, Brenda will provide examples of how structured settlements can affect a plaintiff. Brenda was the first Canadian to receive the designation of Certified Structured Settlement Consultant from Notre Dame University.
